# Break Out Day Session Trips

## Valleys of the Saskatchewan - Friday, June 3

The **Valleys of the Saskatchewan** include the area between the North and South Saskatchewan Rivers, between the cities of Saskatoon and Prince Albert. It was here that Métis people had settled on traditional river lots along the South Saskatchewan River, and established a vibrant community. It was in this area that major engagements between the Métis and government forces took place in the 1880s.

Our first stop will be at **Fort Carlton Provincial Park** which was used as a base for the North West Mounted police and civilian volunteers in the first battle of the North West Resistance. We then move to **Duck Lake Regional Interpretive Centre & Battlefield** where artifacts, art, documents and photographs will help us relive the turbulent late 1880s from three perspectives: First Nations, Métis and pioneer. Onwards to the **Batoche National Historic Site of Canada**, the site of the major battle of the North West Resistance between the Métis and the Canadian Government ([www.trailsof1885.com](http://www.trailsof1885.com)). We end our tour at **Champetre County** ([www.champetrecounty.com](http://www.champetrecounty.com)) where you will be transported back to the gun slinging, horseback riding, “salooning” ways of the Old West before we return to Saskatoon.

### ***First Ever OWC-Tobin Lake Fishing Derby – Sunday, June 5 to Wednesday, June 8***

Rated as "the best walleye fishing in North America", catches at Nipawin's Tobin Lake have broken the Saskatchewan walleye record five times consecutively with a record-setting ice fishing catch of 8.33kg in 2005. In addition to sauger, perch, goldeye and sturgeon, Tobin Lake also hosts Canada's top annual pike event so if you're looking to fight with these big game fish, you will not be disappointed.

Leaving Saskatoon Sunday, June 5, you will be driven to one of Saskatchewan's most competitive sports lakes northeast of the city. Guests will be hosted by MacSwaney's Cabins and Lodge, Tobin Lake's premier four season resort in Nipawin Regional Park. A quick orientation to the lake, the official presentation of your Saskatchewan fishing licenses and the rules of the tournament and you'll be ready for two days of world-class fishing.

*In order to maintain a high quality trophy fishery, our fishing derby will be a catch and release "photo finish" tourney.*

Head out early Monday and continue all day Tuesday with boat and guide provided by Twin Marine Outfitting, to ensure that you hit the hottest spots during the peak of early season fishing. Weather permitting; you'll be treated to classic shore lunches on both days. Don't worry about the extra airline baggage charges – rods and tackle will be provided on-site. (If you are bringing your lucky lure, please note barbless hooks are mandatory on Tobin Lake).

Evening entertainment and local speakers will also be part of the experience. *Spaces for this FAM will be limited to four OWC members with spouses welcome at a cost of \$250 each.* Additional spaces may be available based on spouse numbers. Transportation to Tobin Lake on Sunday, June 5 and returning to Saskatoon Wednesday, June 8 will be provided.

## ***Explore Prince Albert National Park – Sunday, June 5 to Wednesday, June 8***

Celebrating 125 years, our national parks preserve Canada's natural majesty and Prince Albert National Park is no exception as one of Saskatchewan's most beautiful and diverse destinations. Our boreal forest is rich in uniquely Saskatchewan experiences for all explorers.

Leaving Saskatoon Sunday, June 5, you will be driven north to Nesslin Lake, one of crown jewels of Saskatchewan's 100,000 lakes and rivers. Spend the afternoon lakeside and on the trails and the evening. Enjoy a fish fry and stay in cabin accommodations near the lake.

Saddle up on Monday with Sturgeon River Ranch and a trail ride. A working ranch on the west side of the park, Sturgeon River Ranch shares the property with one of Canada's only free-range plains bison herds which you may catch a glimpse of during your day at the ranch.

Monday evening, Waskesiu Marina Adventure Centre will host a tour of Heart Lakes. Don't worry about being saddle sore, as your accommodations Monday and Tuesday evening will be provided by Jewel of the North at nearby Emma Lake.

Dog sledding may be a winter sport, but the training doesn't stop when the snow leaves. Tuesday, you'll be joining Sundogs Sled Excursions and try a cart run and puppy orientation. Meet the team that cares for these dogs, this landscape and this sport and you know you'll be counting down the days until winter

If you have a free hour or two or would like to steal some time away to explore the park on your own, Prince Albert National Park offers activities and tours throughout the day. Self-guided options include short or day hiking on the many trails, take an interpretative tour of the boreal ecology including Saskatchewan's spruce bogs, or take to the waters in a canoe or kayak.

No park experience would be complete without a campfire and hot dog roast, hosted Tuesday night by national park staff that look forward to discussing the park and its national and historical significance.
